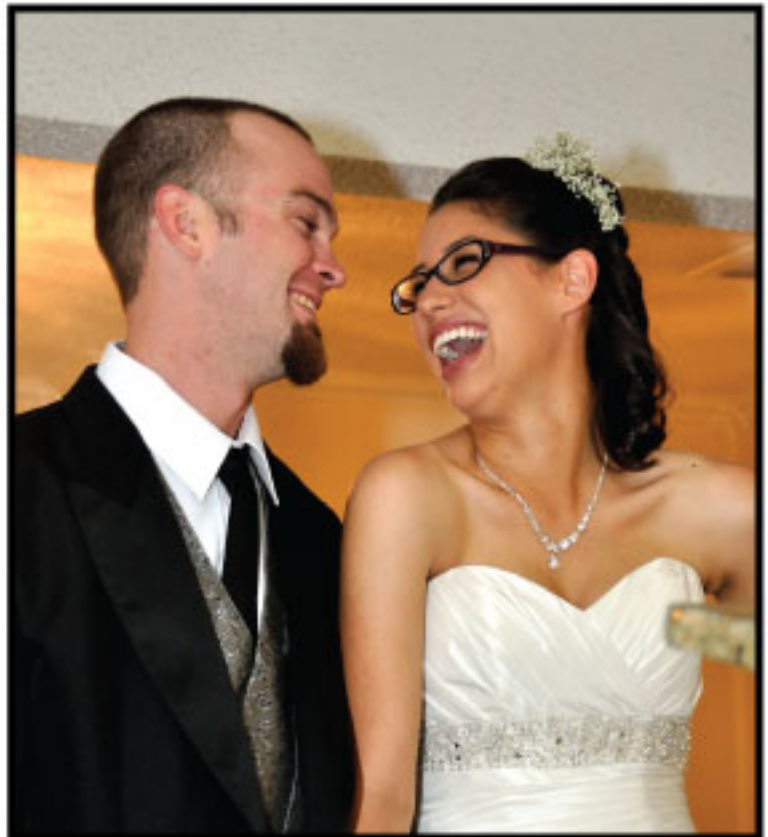

Evan R. Gillins has been a resident of the Antelope Valley since 1965. He has been an active leader with the Boy Scouts of America for 30 years, helping more than 25 boys achieve the rank of "Eagle Scout". Evan has also been a local real estate appraiser for 28 years.

Robin Gillins has been a local Realtor since 1991. She is currently the past year and current year Chapter president of the Antelope Valley Chapter Women's Council of Realtors. On February 27th, 2012, Robin, out of the goodness of her heart, donated one of her kidneys to a dear friend. Although her recovery was much more difficult than anticipated, she is now nearly recovered, and says "It was more than worth it, because it saved my friends life".

Between them, Evan and Robin have 9 children (7 daughters, 2 sons), and 11 grandchildren.

In April of 2010, one of their sons, Evan Gillins Jr., who works as an assistant in his Dads appraisal business, visited the doctor for an odd shaped mole on his chest. It was determined to be Melanoma, stage 1. The mole, a large area of tissue, and several lymph nodes were removed. The situation was scary, but the post-op tests were "all clear", and since the chance of a recurrence is only 3-5%, the family was very relieved. In late April of this year (2012), Evan Jr. went to the doctor with a painful lump in his armpit. To make a long story short, after testing, biopsies, body scans, etc., it was determined that the Melanoma has returned and has been aggressively growing in at least one lymph node. This upgraded his previous stage 1 cancer to stage 3. On 5/11/12, he underwent surgery to remove all of the lymph nodes in the area (about 15), in the hopes of stopping any further invasion. The post-op test results are promising, and at present, chemotherapy or radiation therapy are not anticipated. However, the "follow up preventative treatment shots and medications", known as immunotherapy, and vaccine therapy, are expected to be extensive. Evan Jr. has a new wife Meagan (as of 5/5/12), a son Justin, age 9, and Meagan's son Carson, age 2, a special needs child with Cerebral Palsy, who Evan Jr. cares for as his own.
